Thank you to every donor to the Omoribe Children's Home in 2022. Together you have made possible another year of education and shelter for vulnerable children. In addition, the children each received a new mattress, blanket, plate, spoon and clothing. We appreciate your generosity so much.

Please pray for all of the Omoribe students as they begin a new academic year this month.

Throughout Kenya the school system is switching to the Competency-based Curriculum (CBC) and leaving behind the 8-4-4 system which has been in place since 1985. Thank you donors for providing tuition fees for the kids.

Urgent Need - Beginning in March of 2023 the Omoribe Project is facing a projected **\$900 per month** shortfall for food and firewood for the Omoribe Children's Home residents. Inflation and higher costs associated with the new CBC program have cut funds available for daily expenses at the home. It costs less than \$1.40 per day to feed one child and provide the firewood to cook their meals. Please pray that these funds become available in the next few weeks.
